Maternal Dual Diagnosis:
Perinatal Comorbidity of Mental Illness and Substance Use Disorders

The co-occurrence of substance use disorders with depression and other mood and anxiety disorders is unfortunately quite common among women during the childbearing years. During pregnancy and the postpartum period, dual diagnoses of addictive and other mental disorders raise complicated clinical concerns. Clinical decision-making in this context requires consideration of the relative risks of exposure, for both mother and child, to untreated illness versus available treatments. During this presentation, the audience will be introduced to the reproductive safety data encountered when managing comorbid depression and substance use disorders as well as a rational method for treatment selection to promote both maternal and child well-being.

D. Jeffrey Newport is Professor of Psychiatry & Behavioral Sciences and Obstetrics & Gynecology at the University of Miami Miller School of Medicine. He serves as Director of Women's Reproductive Mental Health and as Medical Director of the Health & Recovery Center at Jackson Behavioral Health Hospital. His awards include the NARSAD Independent and Young Investigator Awards, Young Faculty Award from the American Psychiatric Institute for Research and Education, Lilly Fellowship from the Society of Biological Psychiatry, Laughlin Fellowship from the American College of Psychiatrists, Hoechst Marion Roussel Award from the American Society of Clinical Psychopharmacology, Lilly Research Fellowship from the American Psychiatric Association, Pfizer Psychiatry Resident of the Year Award, the University of South Carolina School of Medicine Distinguished Physician Alumnus Award, and the Emory Psychiatry Excellence in Teaching Award. His publications have appeared in JAMA, American Journal of Psychiatry, American Journal of Obstetrics & Gynecology, Neurology, Biological Psychiatry, Neuropsychopharmacology, Bipolar Disorders, Pediatrics, British Journal of Obstetrics & Gynaecology, Journal of Clinical Psychiatry, etc. Dr. Newport's research focuses on women's mental health with an emphasis on the psychobiology of psychiatric illness and substance use disorders during pregnancy and the postpartum period, the pharmacokinetics of psychotropic medication during pregnancy and lactation, and the persistent neuroendocrine and behavioral impact of early life adverse experiences.
