This presentation will cover the history, diagnosis and treatment of psychological trauma and Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder in the pediatric population. The presentation will make specific emphasis on the psychological sequelae of the recent school shootings that have been covered in the national media.

Speaker: Eugenio M. Rothe, M.D.

Dr. Rothe is Professor of Psychiatry and a Founding Faculty Member of the Herbert Wertheim College of Medicine, Courtesy Professor of the Robert Stempel School of Public Health and Adjunct Professor of the Cuban Research Institute at Florida International University. Dr. Rothe is board certified in Adult, Child and Adolescent and Forensic Psychiatry and a Diplomate in Adult Psychoanalysis. He has written extensively about the mental health issues of immigrants, refugees and patients of diverse cultural backgrounds. He is a member of the editorial board of four scientific journals and holds leadership positions in three national organizations. He has been the recipient of the American Psychiatric Association's Bruno Lima Award for contributions to the treatment and understanding of victims of war and disasters and of the Nancy Roeske Award for Excellence in Medical Student Teaching. He has also received the American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry's Jeanne Spurlock Award for his contributions to the treatment and understanding of children of diverse cultural backgrounds and a Citation for Civilian Merit from the U.S. Armed Forces for his voluntary work on behalf of Cuban refugees. He is first co-author of the Practice Parameters for Cultural Competence for Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and at the University of Miami he was a four-time recipient of the Outstanding Teacher in Psychiatry Award and has also received the Sarah Howell Award for Excellence in Teaching Child Psychiatry. Currently he is the director of the Medical Professionalism Course at the HWCM, which teaches medical students how to practice "the art of medicine". He also has a private practice in Coral Gables.
